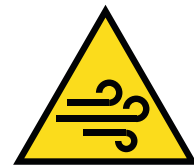




- High winds can topple trees and power lines, cause damage to buildings, trees, and vehicles, and injure anyone in their path.
- If a high wind watch/warning are issued, consider postponing outdoor activities.
- If you are driving:
 - Keep both hands on the wheel and SLOW DOWN;
 - Watch for objects like tree limbs, patio furniture, or garbage cans;
 - Keep a safe distance from other vehicles like semi-trucks and other high-profile vehicles;
 - If you must pull over, get on the road shoulder, stop, stay inside, and turn on your hazard lights.
- If outside without a vehicle:
 - Take cover next to a building or under a shelter;
 - Avoid roads and train tracks;
 - Use handrails while walking;
 - Consider eye protection, wear a mask, and protect your face;
 - Watch for flying debris.
- During high winds, it's best to stay indoors and away from windows.
- Loose objects and debris can become dangerous projectiles in high winds.
- Secure outdoor furniture, decorations, trampolines, and umbrellas BEFORE the wind picks up.
- Do not touch downed lines, assume they are all live and electrified - avoid the area.
- High winds can create dangerous conditions on the water. Boaters should check the weather forecast BEFORE heading out.
- After a high wind event, be cautious when cleaning up debris. Wear protective gear like gloves, sturdy shoes, and watch out for sharp objects.

WIND ADVISORY
Sustained winds of 30 mph for one hour and/or frequent gusts of at least 45 mph are occurring/expected within 36 hours.

HIGH WIND WATCH
Sustained winds of 40 mph for one hour and/or frequent gusts of at least 58 mph are expected in the next 12-48 hours.

HIGH WIND WARNING
Sustained winds of 40 mph for one hour and/or frequent gusts of at least 58 mph are expected in the next 36 hours.
